Please be considerate and avoid capturing images of A.A. members, family members and friends in or around Convention venues who did not give permission and may not wish to appear in your photos/videos.

If you do take pictures or videos with permission, please look around and avoid Convention signs, logos, badges or other A.A. items that, if captured in your photo/video, might suggest A.A. membership.

Please do not take photographs or videos during any of the meetings at the International Convention. Remember: this includes all meetings.

SOCIAL MEDIA

Please avoid sharing about IC 2025 on publicly visible social media.

This includes platforms like Instagram, Facebook, TikTok, YouTube etc.

PRESS

For nearly 90 years, the press has helped A.A. members carry the message of hope and recovery to those still suffering from alcoholism. You can be part of these efforts by:

Maintaining your own anonymity at the level of press, radio, films and Internet.

Remembering that no one person speaks for A.A.; we practice "principles before personalities."

Reminding others that A.A. does not have any opinion on outside issues or comment on public controversies.

Practicing A.A. traditions of anonymity is our collective responsibility. If a journalist or social media personality asks to interview you, please direct them to the Press and Media room – West Building-Room 106.

STADIUM MEETINGS

Reminder: You must have your badge to be admitted to the Stadium. Due to global heightened security, there will be staff looking into bags as you enter BC Place. Please remember that no outside food or beverage will be permitted in the Stadium. All guests will be required to go through magnetron search upon entry.

BAG POLICY

Bags are permitted, provided they fit comfortably under your seat and do not obstruct aisles or exits. Oversized bags that cannot be stored safely under a seat will not be allowed inside.

All bags are subject to search upon entry.

WATER BOTTLES

Guests may bring in personal water bottles up to 1 liter in size, provided they are not made of glass and are emptied prior to entry. Refill stations are available inside the stadium.

All bottles are subject to inspection upon entry.

STADIUM SEATING

We are asking that the first three rows of stadium seats closest to the entrances/exits be reserved for people who do not wish to climb, or who have difficulty climbing, stadium stairs. We would appreciate your consideration and cooperation

STADIUM ACCESSIBILITY ACCESS

For our guests with accessibility needs, there is special access to the stadium and seating in a reserved area near the stage for you and one caregiver/friend. The Accessible Entrance is Gates E and F into the stadium. Use the same gates to exit at the conclusion of the meeting.


